WE ALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO FEEL SAFE AT ALL TIMES !

In the year 2009 it is a sobering reality that in such a technologically advanced society , we still hear of the ongoing tragedy of child abuse, child pornography and domestic violence including physical and sexual abuse. Statistics show us that approximately 96% of children who are abused are abused by someone they know and trust, (Reference, AIHW 2001).

It is estimated that 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 7 boys will experience abuse of some kind in their childhood years. (Reference , Australian Childhood Foundation 2006)

In 2008 the Australian Institute of Child Health and Welfare reported that 309 517 reports of Child Abuse and Neglect were made to authorities during the 2006/07 reporting year in Australia. The issue of child abuse and domestic violence appears so widespread that it is important to educate individuals at school, in the home and in the community on ways in which they personally can play an important part in keeping themselves safe.

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ABUSE CAN BE PREVENTED !

Ignorance of child sexual abuse has been one of the principal factors inhibiting its prevention and prolonging the suffering and distress of its many victims.

National and International studies have shown that the prevention of child sexual abuse is perhaps the most important response to the problem. The most effective prevention strategy available to us is providing children, parents, caregivers, teachers and service providers with the appropriate prevention education.

In order to work towards preventing children becoming victims of abuse particularly sexual abuse it is important to educate children on their rights to personal safety, saying NO to adults that are removing those rights, understanding their bodies and safe and unsafe touching, secrecy and the difference between good and bad secrets, problem solving and persistence in getting the appropriate help.

Overall it is extremely important that we empower children so as they are able to apply these preventative strategies as everyday life skills. The Protective Behaviours Program in fact teaches children all of these preventative strategies in a non threatening and non sexual way.

TRAINING WORKSHOPS

Protective Behaviours WA Incorporated would like to provide your organisation with the opportunity to participate in a Protective Behaviours Training Workshop that has been designed to teach staff, service providers, carer's and parents the strategies of Protective Behaviours in order to increase the personal safety of their students, clients and children.

As a safety program Protective Behaviours provides children and adults with strategies to keep themselves safe and cope with situations which threaten their well being, specifically in areas of child abuse, bullying and domestic violence. The program in essence empowers the individual with the right to feel safe and sets out ways in which they can gain appropriate help when they are not feeling safe.

The Protective Behaviours Program can be presented on it's own or can be included with other programs such as personal development, group work, therapeutic interventions, in the home or in the classroom.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES INCLUDE ARE TO

- Provide teachers, service providers and parents with a knowledge of the content, themes, core concepts and strategies of the Protective Behaviours Program.
- To educate adults and caregivers in the issues of abuse and abuse prevention.
- Develop problem solving and assertiveness skills in children and adults.
- Understanding your legal and legislative requirements in relation to mandatory reporting.
- To assist participants in presenting the program in a manner whereby the process is congruent with the program content.
- To provide teachers, service providers and parents with simple practical teaching activities designed to increase their child's/children's and client's personal safety.
